## MAXIMIZING NOTRUMP

How great is this hand? A maximum 1NT opening.

Your partner responds 2€ (Stayman) to try to uncover an 8-card major suit fit, and rebids 3NT over your 2♥ rebid.

Need 9 tricks, you start by counting your instant winners. You have 2 hearts, 1 diamond and 3 clubs. You need 3 more tricks to make your contract. You can get 2 more by promoting the two spade honors;1 or 2 more by finessing the diamonds; and possibly 1 more if the clubs. The club lead is the best lead you could have gotten. Because you have the  $\pm$ 10 and  $\pm$ 9, you can simply cover the  $\pm$ 9 with the  $\pm$ 10 and it will either hold the trick or be covered by East's  $\pm$ J. Either way, you have four clubs tricks. So your contract is safe. Now is the time to think about overtricks. You should try to finessse the diamond. Lead a club back to your hand and lead a diamond to the dummy's •10. If this holds, come back your hand, again with a club,,and repeat the finesse; this time inserting the •Q. Now lead a low spade to the the •K in your hand and keep playing spades until the opponents take their •A. They will probably lead a heart, which you win with the •A, and lead another diamond to your dummy's •A. Both opponents follow, so you can now take your dummy's good •Q and •J and get back you your hand with the •K and cash the 13<sup>th</sup> diamond in your hand. You should end up with 12 tricks because of your good luck in the 3-3 split of the diamond, the club lead and the fact that the •KJ were both in West.

However, if you didn't take all those precautions you would have only made 10 or 11 tricks. In matchpoint play, you always try to maximize your tricks.
