▲♥◆▲ EVERY LITTLE CARD IS IMPORTANT ▲♥◆▲

North is the dealer and opens $1 \clubsuit$. East passes and you respond $1 \heartsuit$ with this hand:




West overcalls 2 and partner rebids his clubs – 3♣. West passes and it's back to you.

The first thing you notice is your self sufficient heart suit. A self-sufficient suit it one that can serve as trump without any help from your partner. He can have a void in hearts and you can still pull all the trump from the oppoents.

This hand qualifies for Losing Trick Count analysis, since you have a fit in hearts. Of course, it is a fit with yourself – but still a fit.

Even though you have only 11 HCP, you have only 7 losers. Your partner has 7 or few losers, since he opened. That adds up to 14 losers. Subracting 14 from 24, you get 10 winners. Your rebid should be $4 \checkmark$. This ends the auction and West lead the $4 \checkmark$.



West's Lead: ♦A



West follows with the \blacklozenge K, East playing the \blacklozenge 10 and \blacklozenge 6, in that order. West then leads the \blacklozenge Q. What is your plan?

Your hand has 2 losing spades and 3 losing diamonds. Many declarers would simply ruff the 3rd diamond in the dummy and discard 2 losing spades on the AKQ. Then get back to their hand with a spade ruff, to pull the rest of the trump, and claim.

That wouldn't work. East played a high-low signal on the first two diamonds. He will over-ruff your ♥5 and lead a spade. That puts you back on the board with the ♠A.

When you play the clubs, West ruffs the second club and you are set, losing two diamonds, a diamond over-ruff and a club ruff.

In effect, you wasted the little trump in the dummy when you knew it couldn't win the trick. Notice how much more effective it would be to discard a black card on the \blacklozenge Q and give West the first three diamond tricks. That's all they can get. West's best defense is to switch to a spade at trick 4. You win the \spadesuit A and use your little \heartsuit 5 to get back to you hand and pull the outstanding 6 hearts. Now you can take all the rest of the tricks with a combinations of dummy's clubs and your remaining trump.

Partner didn't have much to give you in hearts, but even is little singleton ♥5 was not to be wasted!
