Your are the dealer in the South:


You open 1 NT and it gets passed out. West leads the ${ }^{5}$. Is there any way of guaranteeing your contract?

The first thing you should notice is that you have 6 top tricks; 2 hearts, 2 diamonds and 2 clubs. You need only 1 more trick. It can come from either 4card minor if one or both of them break $3-3$. There is only at $35 \%$ probability that either suit will break evenly. Is there a better way?

Yes, there is and it doesn't involve either minor suit. You can get one spade winner through length. You win the first heart and lead a spade to the dummy's 410. East will probably win and return a heart. You win and lead a second spade to the $\$ 8$. West will win and run his remaining 3 hearts. But then he will have to lead a minor suit. You win and lead your third spade - the $\mathbf{~} \mathbf{J}$. They will win this but again, they will have to lead a minor suit. Whichever suit they lead,
you will win and can now play the fourth spade - the 9 which is guaranteed to be a winner. You make your 1NT contract.
