
A ♥ ♦ ♠ TAP THE DECLARER ♠ ♥ ♦ ♠

Take a look at this deal:



You are sitting South and East/West have an uncontested auction, ending in $4 \clubsuit$, by East. It's your lead.

When you are blessed with 4 or more cards in the trump suit, the best lead is a singleton – for obvious reasons. Without a singleton, the best lead is from a "lump". This is is long chunky suit. Declarer will be short in that suit and will probably ruff after a few rounds. But, that's the objective. Make the declarer use his 5-card trump suit and reduce his trump holding to fewer than your own. That's called "Tapping the Declarer."

You lead the ♥5 and dummy plays low. North has two honors in the suit – one above and one below the dummy's honor. The correct play is to insert the lower honor – the ♥J. This win the trick and partner now leads the ♥A and another Heart. Declarer will ruff and start to pull trump. You will wait until East plays dummy's last spade and take your ♠A. Now the ♥K will force the Declarer to use his last trump.

East will now take all his remaining winners. But, when he gets to the third Diamond, you will ruff with your \$\ldots 5\$ and win your last Heart. That's down 2. And that's Tapping the Declarer.
